Your development officer (DO) will be there to assist and advise your club on grant/loan applications to Croquet England plus other sources of funding e.g. Crowdfunding

In addition, your DO is your first point of contact with regards to a wide range of croquet related issues, for example:

- Lawn management
- Handicapping
- Coaching
- Refereeing
- Playing equipment
- Recruitment and retention

As a team of DOs we won't hold all the answers to your questions but will point you in the right direction e.g. expert, company/organisation, another club, or all three.

Your DO will be in touch soon to introduce themselves and have an initial discussion to learn about your current and future needs.

WCF Advantage Scoring Trial Approved

You may have already read about this trial, if not, do read on and consider whether you club would like to participate in the trial.

Please note that the SWF fully supports this – anything that makes the scoring easier has got to be a good thing – we will not be including GC Handicap League Play in the trial.

We have all spent a lot of time getting to grips with the previous system and now is not the moment to try something different.

We hope the trial will help inform our decisions about next year's Leagues and would be interested to hear from any SWF clubs who decide to take part in the trial.

Roy Tillcock writes:

I have now received approval from WCF for this trial to take place.

Participation in the trial is optional. If a club wishes to take part please read the Terms of Reference – see Appendix 1.

I must receive a contact name and email address of a lead person (called the Trial Officer) to whom I will forward official trial documentation explaining the use of Target Scores in Advantage games.

The trial uses the 2024/25 Version of the Starting Scores table (handicaps -6 to 14) adapted for Target Scores use.

Responses to the three questions in the Terms of Reference should be sent to me by the Trial Officer at the end of the season. Participating players are encouraged to send individual feedback to the WCF Advantage email address at any time.

Brian Wainman's Bisque Calculator – an update

Following Brian's item in the previous issue of Cygnet, the possibility of developing an app rather than using a website was raised and put to Brian. He replies:

With regards to online/offline, I get this a lot in my job which is a data manager for clinical trials. The people running the trial always want to get participants to complete questionnaires when they are offline, and then upload when they are connected.

It really just adds lots of cost (clever programming and more management etc) and is never used. Remote internet connection is only ever going to get better, but the real problem is keeping the offline App up to date.

If the user downloads it and then never connects to update it, it can get out of date and the user will use an out-of-date version. After all, there are the paper documents, which will always be available for dead battery, offline etc.

We have a little list ... are you on it?

There is an amazing resource on the CqE website – the Members' Directory.

This is a tool for

- > individual members
 - to keep their personal details and handicaps up to date – and to share them as broadly or narrowly as they chose
 - to contact members across the country
- > clubs
 - o to record their membership details and payments
 - to list their officers and key people: handicappers, welfare officers etc
 - to find out useful information e.g. handicap range at a glance
- > the SWF
 - to identify in one easy step all the handicappers,
 coaches, welfare officers and so on, so we can send information relevant to their role direct to their inbox

But not every club uses this to its full potential, or even at all, so this is a call out urging you to check it out and get using it!

CqE: Player Pathway

Are you following the progress of this CqE initiative? This is a brief summary of the webinar a few weeks ago and you can keep up to date by keeping an eye on the CqE website.



Ian Burridge led a discussion on CqE's proposed Player Pathway which had been sent to all clubs and federations for comment. Around 30 people attended the webinar and the key points for me were:

- ✓ The consensus was that it is a good idea
- ✓ Changes need to be made to the design colour etc.
- ✓ Changes could be made to make it a more efficient web-based tool
- ✓ That Levels 1 and 2 could be merged as there is a lot of overlap
- ✓ Quite a bit of discussion about how difficult it can be to find out information
 - CqE website difficult to negotiate
 - You don't know what you don't know
 - How do you get croquet players to read anything!
- ✓ It's fine encouraging people to enter tournaments, but what if they don't get a place for some reason
 - Use of D grades doesn't make it easy sometimes
- ✓ Hopefully reference will be made to the work of clubs and federations with beginners and the earlier stages of player development

Clubs will be invited to trial the scheme later this year with a view to introducing it fully in 2026 including any identified modifications.

CqE: Action for AC

Another initiative from CqE – this time to revitalise AC. Led by Debbie Lines, a working group is considering ways of reversing the demise of this form of play. An interesting webinar was held recently which demonstrated just how personally and fervently some players tackle this.

It struck me that action can be taken on a number of fronts:


- ✓ Recruitment acknowledging the different AC / GC mindsets and targeting recruitment appropriately overcoming the public perception! It's a myth that AC is for everyone it's not!
- Coaching a really difficult one to have some sort of structure that meets the needs of beginners / improvers who develop at different rates
- ✓ Inclusion most clubs are looking for good club members (not just players) who will help with the running of the club in some way, so a good mentoring programme and getting other members involved in this is crucial
- ✓ Development particularly over the first 2-3 years so people can find their level and get addicted to the club! It would be lovely to have clear pointers to videos that demonstrate different stages of play and tactics the Oxford site is really good for this but would anyone have the time to reference other really good sources?
- ✓ A series of class tournaments as with GC. I think Federations are good at offering the first 'out of club' match experience and a set of class AC tournaments could take that on a step further?

Summary of SWF League Rule Changes 2024

No apologies for publishing this again



- Warm-up Time: Previously "up to 10 minutes", the warm-up period is now "at least 10 minutes". This also implies that the visitors should arrive in good time to allow for this warm up before the agreed start time.
- Match Referee: A match referee must be identified before play begins. If no qualified referee is present, an experienced player should be selected.
- Play-Off Venues: Play-offs (but not finals) can be held at a mutually agreed neutral club to avoid overnight stays if the two clubs are more than two hours apart. See Appendix "Alternative Play-Off Venue" for details.

AC Level Play League

New Entrants Placement: The SWF League Secretary may now place new entrants into a
division appropriate to their skill level, rather than defaulting them to the bottom division.
(This rule does not apply to the GC league, where a Premier block place must be earned by
winning a Regional block, and new entrants cannot be placed directly into the Premier
block.)

GC Leagues

- Advantage Play: Advantage Play will now be used for all handicap matches. Separate guidance on this will be published following the Zoom meeting on 11th February.
 - Meanwhile, the WCF has published an extended starting scores chart, and a useful presentation on the system is available https://worldcroquet.org/advantagegc/
- Pairing of Opponents: Rule 9a improved to avoid unnecessary waiting when players and lawns are available, but a team captain is still in play: "It is recommended that, to avoid unnecessary delay, the captains agree on the players for the current round and the next."
- Wrong Ball forestalling: Appendix 4. The GC Rules specify that all players and referees are
 responsible for forestalling play in any game where a wrong ball is about to be played or has
 been played. A non-playing captain shall be treated as a playing member of the team. The
 home team captain should ensure that spectators who are neither referees nor players do
 not forestall, but they may alert an appropriate person to watch for a wrong ball if they
 believe that the play is out of sequence.

Appendix 1

ADVANTAGE GC TRIAL OF TARGET SCORES TERMS OF REFERENCE

Background

In an Advantage game each player is set a fixed (and usually different) target number of hoops needed to win. Using the current published Starting Scores Method, each player's starting score is adjusted (referenced by the Table of Starting Scores) so that they are both set the same winning score of 7 (or 4, or 10 depending on the variant).

For most games, the stronger player is required to start with a negative score. Many players have found the use of negative values challenging. They are also put off by the loss of the conventional 'sum of scores to hoop number' relationship. As a result, a significant number of players are known to have been discouraged from playing Advantage.

An alternative Target Scores Method, that eliminates both of these difficulties, has been developed under which the score starts at 0: 0, and all scores are expressed as positive numbers.

To reflect players' differences in their handicaps / DGrades, players/sides are given target scores (i.e. the score they need to achieve to win) by reference to a Table of Target Scores. It is important to understand that the Target Scores Method has no effect on a game's outcome or the tactical challenge posed to the players – it is simply an alternative scoring method avoiding negative values.

Trial Purpose

To evaluate the effectiveness of this alternative Target Scores Method, the WCF (AGCOC) has commissioned this trial.

Trial

During the trial an event organiser (tournament manager etc) will have the option to score all games in their event using the Target Scores Method.

Trial Methodology

The Chair AGCOC is to invite appropriate organisations to participate in the trial. Those who wish to do so are to receive full documentation describing the suggested way to employ Target Scores in their games.

A trial condition is that each organisation defines a specific person to be their Trial Officer. All participating players are to be invited by the Trial Officer to mail individual feedback to advantagegc@worldcroquet.org at any time during the trial.

The WCF would particularly appreciate feedback related to the trial's How to Play instructions. The trial is expected to start on 1 Apr 25. After six months of trial experience, participating Trial Officers are to be asked to provide feedback to AGCOC by answering three questions.

1. Did experienced Advantage players generally find Target Scores Method easier, similar to, or more difficult to use than Starting Scores Method?

- 2. Was it generally easier, similar to, or more difficult to teach new players to score using Target Scores Method when compared with Starting Scores Method?
- 3. Which would you prefer to use for scoring Advantage games: Target Scores Method or Starting Scores Method?

The feedback received from players and Trial Officers is to be collated, analysed and reported to AGCOC.
