Both Bristol "C" and Nailsea "B" came into the match unbeaten; with 3 wins each from their matches against Bristol "D", East Dorset "B" and Sidmouth "B".

The morning singles were shared 1-1, with Andrew Wise (Bristol), narrowly edging out Robert Upton (Nailsea) and Andrew Wimshurst (Nailsea) beating Wayne Wiseman (Bristol); all on the partly shadowy Lawn 1. So, Nailsea "B" won 4-3 and were crowned 2025 Champions of SWF, AC Advanced Play, Division 3 and gained promotion to Division 2 for 2026. They were presented with a SWF commemorative plaque by Linda Shaw, the South West Croquet Federation Chair.
